PASTORS

In Roman Catholic, Orthodox and Episcopal churches the clergy are often called **priests**. Priests intercede for the members of the church with God. Priests are intermediaries, standing between the people and God and connecting them, one to the other.

In Reformed churches (ours), clergy are often called **ministers**. Ministers do what the title suggests: they make less of themselves and more of God and others. Ministers primarily teach and preach the Word of God.

And then there are **pastors**. **Pastor** comes from **pasture**. Pastors guide, protect and care for the flock. That means that pastor and shepherd mean the very same thing. The work of a pastor is primarily relational. As Jesus describes his Good Shepherd identity: **I know my own and my own know me**. In this work of shepherding, pastors are not servants of the desires of the sheep. Instead, pastors are servants of the will of God for God's people. That means that pastors must sometimes lead the sheep to a place that they don't want to go, even though it is a place of grace and blessing far more rich than what the sheep might choose on their own.

Pastor is the title I resonate with the most in my ministry because I think it best fits what God has called me to do. Because pastoral work is all about relationships, it's very personal. Just now, we're feeling that personal dimension as we anticipate **Pam Keckler's** retirement. And we're feeling that as new pastoral relationships are formed.

Even before **Elizabeth Hartung-Ciccolini** was called to be our Associate Pastor for Youth and Children, Elizabeth had deep relationships with our children, youth, and their families. With the reduction of our pastoral staff, it's no longer possible for Elizabeth's shepherding care to focus solely on a segment of our congregation. In recognition of that reality, the Spiritual Council changed Elizabeth's title to simply **Associate Pastor** at its meeting on February 26. That means that Elizabeth and I will be sharing ministry with the whole congregation.

And that also means building new relationships. In that process please be patient with us! And please accept us – even welcome us – into your lives. At its heart I believe that vital pastoral care can't be done without Christian community. And vital pastoral care can't be achieved unless we follow the Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ.

So please say an encouraging word to Elizabeth on her new title. It's an honor in that it indicates how much confidence I and you have in her ministry...not to mention our Good Shepherd, Jesus. See you in church!

SPIRITUAL COUNCIL REPORT FEBRUARY 26, 2019

In February, the Spiritual Council met in the Youth Room. Spiritual Council meetings will continue to be held in the Youth Room until the Founders Room becomes available again.

Treasurer's Report: Chris Clark recapped the good news that we ended 2018 with a budget surplus of around \$8,000. He also reported that we have begun tapping into funds from our construction loan to cover construction costs. Because of Forward in Faith pledge fulfillment to date, we were able to start borrowing on the loan later than anticipated, which will save on interest in the long run.

Construction Update: Our contractor is still hopeful that the Commons and other new spaces will be substantially finished in time for Easter. In anticipation, the Construction Committee is creating a master plan for furnishing our beautiful new gathering areas in a coordinated way. **New to You** (formerly the **Resale Shop**) will have its grand re-opening after construction is complete.

Title Change: The Spiritual Council approved a motion to officially change Elizabeth Hartung-Ciccolini's title. Formerly, she was Associate Pastor for Youth and Children. Her new title of Associate Pastor reflects her expanded responsibilities.

Mission and Marketing: A congregation member has offered to fund an opportunity for GCC to work with the agency that helped the United Church of Christ define and promote its messaging in a national campaign. The goal of the project is to help us determine the best ways to crystallize our own message, share it with the community, and enhance our membership. The Spiritual Council voted to accept this generous offer. More information will be available soon.

I recently was having a very down day, felt tired, hadn't slept well, felt alone with my wife at work and was just not feeling emotionally well. In mid-afternoon, the mail came, bringing me a big red envelope which I realized was a Valentine. It surprised me, as it was early, and I realized too, from the handwriting, that it was from my younger brother. I am the eldest of a family of six children, and we grew up on a small farm, where we felt safe and loved, but feelings were never expressed. There was no kissing, few hugs or compliments and definitely no "I love you." That's why I was shocked by my brother's card as I began to read it. This had certainly never happened before. The note inside the card was touching and meaningful to me and became, as I read it, a God Moment. He said how much he cared about me, that he felt I had been a great example for all my siblings; and that my love for others had been a great spiritual and practical guide for them to follow. He underlined that he is "proud of me" and that I am "very special" to him. His note closed by saying, as he had never expressed before, "I love you."

I felt so revived, so pleased and so up lifted that, in those moments, my day became great. I stopped and thanked God for that Moment.


