## Oldest Living Parish Nurse!

In September I attended the *25th Annual Westberg Parish Nurse Symposium* in St. Louis, MO. The Deaconess Health System has been the home of the International Parish Nurse Resource center since 2001. Before that time, the Resource Center was housed at Lutheran General Hospital in Park Ridge, IL. As Parish Nursing is growing so is the International Resource Center. By the end of October, the Resource Center moved to Memphis, TN and is part of the Church Health Center, the largest faith-based clinic of its kind in the U.S.

The theme of the Symposium was "Celebrating Our Past, Present, and Future." I, along with the Director of Advocate Health Care's Parish Nurse Ministry presented a program titled "Back to the Future". I was able to share what it meant to be one of the first parish nurses working with Rev. Dr. Granger Westberg, founder of parish nursing, who would refer to us as "six brave nurses". Granger envisioned parish nursing as a partnership between health care systems and congregations. The movement today includes 15,000 parish nurses serving in 23 countries on five continents. I included in my presentation the vision Glenview Community Church had so many years ago, by agreeing to be a part of this new ministry. I remember, during my interview, the committee sharing with me that, even though they had budgeted for a new roof on the church, they would instead use a tarp, if necessary, just to allow this ministry to begin. As someone applying for the position, I was extremely impressed by the support for this new nursing specialty.

Now, after 25 years in this role, I am still impressed with the support. It continues to be an amazing journey working with you, the members. Offering programs dealing with health of body, mind and spirit; ministering to the sick and lonely; meeting with members on a one to one basis;

allowing for soul to soul conversations in a retreat setting, establishing opportunities for members to gather in community for fellowship and fun are ways that continue to excite me.

As I shared at our Leadership Retreat in August, I now have the distinction of being known as "the oldest living parish nurse"! We all laughed about this unique honor! However, I'm proud of this title and proud of this church for believing in a vision, an idea so unique to the medical profession, yet courageous enough to say "yes" in 1986 to place a nurse on staff in its church. 14,999 parish nurses plus 1 thank you!

## Special Congregational Meeting - To Appoint the Senior Minister Search Committee

The Executive Board has nominated the committee to conduct the search for our next Senior Minister. The committee must now be approved by the congregation at a special meeting for such purpose to be held on Sunday, November 20, 2011, at 11 AM in the sanctuary (right after our 10 AM worship service). The vote will be yes or no for the committee as a whole. The proposed committee is composed of the following members:

As in the past, the Moderator will serve on the committee in an ex officio manner.

We wanted to pick a diverse group, with a good mix of men and women, young and older members and a diverse mix of experience working in wide and various capacities in the church. We also stressed the high level of time commitment required. Most importantly, everyone on the proposed committee understands the importance of this process of selecting our next Senior Minister and is fully dedicated to the task.

The committee will first meet to develop the church profile which will describe Glenview Community Church, its demographics, programs, missions and ministry. We expect that during this process, the members of the congregation will be asked to complete a survey on what qualities are desired in a new Senior Minister. After our church profile is completed and approved by the Chicago Metropolitan Association, it will be submitted to the UCC where it can be viewed by prospective candidates for Senior Minister. The Search Committee will then review all of the submitted ministerial profiles and begin to select those to be interviewed and visited. Based on our Constitution, the selected ministerial candidate must be approved by two thirds of the congregation present at the special meeting of the congregation. This entire process is expected to take 9 to 12 months but the time frame for this process can vary widely.

## DID YOU KNOW?

Although the story has remained the same throughout the last 60 years, many changes have taken place.



In 1963 Sally Clonts became the new director of the Pageant. Over the next 18 years Sally's creative genius added many roles to the Pageant. Sally, a graduate of Northwestern's School of Music, also brought many changes to the music of the Pageant. The songs that she added were the very mystical, *Gian Carol Menotti's March of the Three Kings*, the beautiful scriptures of



*The Beatitudes*, the soft *Randall Thompson's Noel*, and the trumpet like *Fanfare for Christmas* by Martin Shaw. In 1975 she brought back *Gesu Bambino*, which had been sung in the early years, in a different version for the newly created Dancing Mary role. All of these are still part of the Pageant today.

As the number of children in the church grew, Sally always found ways to include all who wanted to participate. The Standard Bearer was added in 1966 for a boy with special needs. The Drummer was added in 1976, to keep a young boy busy while his mother was in the hospital.

In 1970's the youth choir, The Singing Stones under the direction of Ron Clonts, was in full swing, and the number of children who wanted to participate grew. Out of the youth choir was a group of dancers lead by Marilyn Berquist, a high school friend of Sally's, also a Northwestern graduate. Marilyn took over the Angels after Agnes Cashman retired. They developed the part of Dancing Mary in 1975



to provide a venue for these dancers to show their talent. In 1976, Pink Angels were added for second grade girls. The second grade boys as banner boys were not added until much later in 1991.

Now, thirty years after Sally's era, her many creative contributions continue to shine throughout the Pageant. Today like Sally we continue to strive to have all the children of the church be a part of this unique tradition.

All children grades kindergarten through high school in the Glenview Community Church are invited to participate in "The Nativity" on December 4, 2011. The Christmas Pageant is produced and performed as a gift to our church congregation and the community at large. There are specific parts and costumes for each grade level and only one rehearsal day—December 3-- for grades K-6 (except 2nd grade girls who have special rehearsal days and times).
